
Plan Commission Handbook





Land use is impacted by a complex and changing set of issues. Center for Land Use Education (CLUE) specialists engage in teaching, outreach, and research to help future planners, individuals, and communities identify these issues, make well-informed fand use decisions, and work towards sustainable outcomes.

Utility Scale Solar Education

Lynn Markham provided educational assistance to multiple groups about decision-makers and criteria used for utilityscale solar in Wisconsin. While land use decisions are made by local governments, large solar projects, 100 megawatts ("700 acres) or large, are decided by the Wisconsin Public Service Commission (PSC). Local government has no legal authority and local government staff, officials and residents are struggling to understand the complex legal process and how to participate in a meaningful way, including understanding what weight the PSC will give to local governments or residents when they present at the one public hearing.

Markham provided educational assistance to the Town of Grant (Portage County) in revising their solar overlay map and rationale identifying land areas where the town feels solar projects greater than 100 MW are and are not compatible to adopt as part of their comprehensive plan. She has presented on decision-makers and criteria used for utility-scale solar in Wisconsin to over 350 participants from 23 counties:

- Portage County Leadership program
- Wisconsin Towns Association
- · Ongoing discussions with local government officials and staff
- Ongoing discussions with nonprofits including: Wisconsin Wildlife Federation, Wisconsin Greenfire, RENEW Wisconsin, Midwest Renewable Energy Association, and local groups

Wisconsin Public Radio Manure Digester Interview

Wisconsin Public Radio (WPR) interviewed Lynn Markham as part of a story on manure digesters in Wisconsin. While the story focused on concerns about pollution from manure digesters in Kewanee county, the article also provided an overview of manure digesters' potential pollution reduction. Markham talked about current policies regarding digester electricity and natural gas production and their link to farm size. 


Fig. 7. Final suitability map with scores ranging from zero to 10 with 10 being the most suitable for utility scale solar.
